DR. FIRMAN A. EARLY DISTINGUISHED MINISTRY AWARD

Throughout college, his business grew into much more than just repairing Xbox 360s. Since he started in 2010, he's seen his company evolve from the spare bedroom to the garage, to a little strip mall space in Brandon, to a small warehouse unit, to a few warehouse units, to now, a newly constructed 64,000 sq. ft. warehouse and refurbishment facility. Bobby currently resides in Sioux Falls and runs his company, CaveGamers, out of the newly constructed warehouse on the west side of Sioux Falls. JACQUELYN DOOYEMA '12

Jacquelyn (Trego) Dooyema has been a pelvic floor physical therapist for nearly a decade and is the owner of Fearless Physiotherapy, offering in-home women's health physical therapy services across the region. Jackie has been a practicing PT since 2015, earning her Bachelor of Science degree at USF and her Doctor of Physical Therapy degree at the University of South Dakota. Following a few years of outpatient orthopedic work, God led her to become a pelvic floor PT when she and her husband moved to Nashville, TN, where she was the clinic director of an outpatient pelvic specialty clinic. Upon returning to South Dakota, her family claimed she gained a southern accent, but what she really came away with was a desire to care for pregnant and postpartum women. She realized a significant need for specific education and care for these women in the region and founded Fearless Physiotherapy. Jackie holds unique training in obstetrics physical therapy and works with women to improve aches and pains during pregnancy. She guides her patients with proper modifications while pregnant to help them continue to do what they enjoy, addressing all things related to the birthing process to prepare patients for labor and delivery. Jackie assists in postpartum recovery and navigating what's normal and what's not in their postpartum journey, whether days, weeks or years post-baby. She is passionate about pelvic physical therapy for women. Jackie desires to bridge the gap in care, as well as advocate, educate and strengthen prenatal and postpartum women to help them achieve their highest activity potential. Jackie and her husband, Sam Dooyema (a 2013 USF alumnus), reside in Sioux Falls and are the parents to three beautiful children: Hannah, Josiah and Cora.

DR. THOMAS A. JESCHKE '64

Dr. Thomas Jeschke was born in 1942 in Dayton, OH, and adopted by Reuben and Sabina Jeschke. He was raised in Sioux Falls and graduated from Sioux Falls College with a teaching degree in 1964. During his time at Sioux Falls College, he was an exchange student in the Philippines. In 1963, Tom married Conni Bishop. They moved to Greeley, CO, where he completed his master's and doctorate degrees in special education at the University of Northern Colorado. In 1965, Tom began his career as a teacher in Sioux Falls. Moving to Des Moines, IA in 1970, he started as principal at Rose School. Dr. Jeschke was known to his colleagues, staff and students as a compassionate, caring educator who received many awards during his tenure at the Des Moines Public Schools. In 1977, he became director and then executive director of special education, expanding to executive director of student services in 1990. He served the district for 33 years. Tom also served as chair of the school district's Pupil Assignment Council, Executive Council Administrators for Special Education and was a member of the Juvenile Justice Task Force. He was a board member of the Governor's Council for Developmental Disabilities, Iowa Special Olympics, Polk County Health Service Board and Easter Seals Advisory Board. Tom enjoyed spending time with family, friends, his dogs, grilling, golfing, traveling and fishing. He was a creative artist, developing skills in carving, painting, pottery, stained glass and much more. Dr. Jeschke passed away on March 20, 2023, after a short battle with pancreatic cancer.

Elias Kifon Bongmba earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in mass communications and sociology from Sioux Falls College in 1987, graduating cum laude. He earned his Master of Divinity degree from North American Baptist Seminary in Sioux Falls in 1989, a Master of Arts degree from the University of Iowa and Ph.D. in philosophy and theology from the University of Denver and the Illiff School of Theology. Since 1995, he has held the Harry and Hazel Chavanne Chair in Christian Theology in the department of religion at Rice University, where he teaches African Religions and World Christianity. He has also directed several doctoral and mater's theses and served as evaluator for 14 international dissertations. Elias has published three books, coauthored a fourth book and edited six books and 80 peer reviewed journal articles and book chapters. He has delivered 93 invited lectures and 73 conference papers around the world. His many public engagements include lectures for the President Thabo Mbeki Institute and also The Thabo Mbeki Presidential Library in South Africa. Elias and his wife, Dr. Odelia Bongmba, founded the Wimbum Cultural and Development Association. They have worked with that association and other donors to raise money for Ndu Baptist Hospital in Cameroon. Elias and Odelia are members of South Main Baptist Church in Houston, TX, where Odelia sings in the sanctuary choir. Their immediate family includes three adult sons, Donald, Dino and Douglas, their daughter in-law Dr. Mabel Bongmba and two grandchildren, Amara and Ikem.
